What Are My Rights for Inheriting a Co-op Apartment?

If a unit owner is deceased and the property is turned over to the estate, what are rights of a relative, for example, let's say the apartment owner's siblings, to allow them to move in and take actual possession? What happens if there is no will transferring ownership?
